There are 16 themed bedrooms, each with two queen beds, and private baths. It has its own private chef. Have coffee by the fireplace or on the deck, drink a root beer in The Thirsty Boot, go for a nature hike by the lake, or see the horses and other animals. All this, as we retreat with God.

Rev. Pat Hammond is a lifelong Presbyterian who served the Church as an ordained Ruling Elder for 28 years before discerning her call to seminary. Pat graduated from Dubuque Theological Seminary in May 2012 and was ordained as a Teaching Elder in the PCUSA in August 2013. She serves as Associate Pastor for Congregational Care at First Presbyterian Church, Sioux Falls.

Synod School

Synod School was held the last week of July in Storm Lake, Iowa, at Beuna Vista University. What a joy to worship, sing, play, and learn with over 700 Presbyterians. 150 of the attendees were babies, children and teens. **Let Justice Flow** was the theme of the event with the Reverend J Herbert Nelson, Stated Clerk of the Presbyterian Church (USA), leading convocation each morning.

There were many classes and it was difficult to decide which classes to take. I taught an afternoon class each day on the subject of *Palestine: the Good, the Bad, the Ugly*.

One of the classes I took was called, *Moving the Conversation on White Privilege Forward*. One of our discussions was to consider why we use the words “black” and “brown” to describe dirty, dying people in sin without God, contrasted with “white” to describe people who have been washed clean and forgiven.

Do you remember “*The Wordless Book*,” a simple tool for presenting the Gospel to kids who couldn’t read. With just five colors—one for each finger on your hand—you could memorize the whole Gospel story. **Black** was for sin, **Red** for Christ’s blood shed on the cross, **White** for our hearts washed clean, **Gold** for our home in Heaven, and **Green** for the new life God creates in us.

Now, no one aims to send a message promoting racism while teaching the Gospel. We don’t mean to imply that people with white skin are God’s chosen, forgiven, beloved people while those with dark, black, or brown skin are icons for death, sin and evil.

The metaphors of darkness and light, dirty and clean, are powerful ways to express what God’s redemptive work does in our lives, neighborhoods, and world. God makes all things new, washing us clean, bringing light where there was none.

So, can we do a better job at watching our language?

Let us consider how we might express this Good News and make sure that everyone can hear this basic, world-changing fact: Jesus loves the little children, ALL the children of the world.

These are some thoughts from Catherine McNiel, author of *Long Days of Small Things: Motherhood as a Spiritual Discipline*.

One of the benefits of Synod School is to exercise our mind to think “outside the box” or “outside of our comfort range.” This class made me do this.

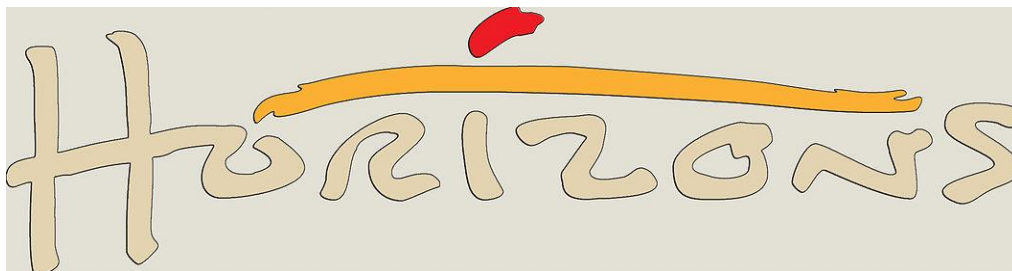

Walking with Jesus – Presbyterian Women of the Presbytery Spring Gathering

Presbyterian Women held their Presbytery Spring Gathering on Saturday, April 29, at the Kimball Protestant Parish. It was a day of fellowship, worship, information, food, and fun as approximately 30 women came together to put faith into action. The women of Kimball Protestant Parish provided a light breakfast, a salad lunch, and a snack for the road. All appreciated the home made items and enjoyed fellowship around the tables.

Since mission is dominant for PW some tables were filled with information about mission projects PWs around the presbytery are involved with. There were a number of quilts made by the women of Kimball Protestant Parish. They began making quilts in 1982 and have made 2,697 quilts to date. In 2010 they made 211 quilts. These quilts go to Lutheran World Relief; Pine Ridge and Standing Rock reservations; Ronald McDonald House; Chamberlain Crisis Center; Lutheran Outdoors; Tornado/fire victims and others in need; Chamberlain Academy; and Kimball High School graduates. In 2008 twenty quilts were sent to Rim Rock Presbyterian Camp. Another twenty-five were sent to Tree of Life Women's Shelter (Native American).

Other displays were from:

Toys for God's Kids Duane Strand of Platte makes wooden toys for children. The mission statement reads: *To provide handmade, sturdy, attractive wooden toys, **Free** to God's children everywhere.*

Days for Girls Because every girl and woman has inherent worth and dignity *Days for Girls* provides sustainable feminine hygiene solutions and health education. Presbyterian Disaster Assistance Both the emergency kits PWs put together for PDA and the Disaster Preparedness Training provided by PW in conjunction with PDA.

In His Steps: Pathways of Peace Our focus mission for the gathering. *Mara li' Mara / Woman to Woman* – a breast cancer project in Palestine. Judy Rops, nurse, breast cancer survivor, and active member of PW spoke to the group about this mission (IHS). She went to Palestine as a volunteer to help educate women about breast cancer. Her presentation gave us a better understanding of Palestine and specifically how much need there is for education about breast cancer. Breast cancer, the most common cancer among Palestinian women, is an urgent public health problem. IHS project will develop within the local health care system, a culturally sensitive program to provide quality medical services for early breast cancer detection, diagnosis and treatment (within Palestine) for the most marginalized. This mission is of sufficient merit that it received a \$50,000 grant from the 2017 Thank Offering of the Presbyterian Women in the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.), Inc.

After lunch there was a business meeting; installation of new officers; and Pastor Lori Robinson graciously led the worship service and served communion to all in attendance.

The next meeting of Presbyterian Women of the Presbytery will be the *Faithful Women Fall Retreat* on September 23-24, 2017, at Joy Ranch near Watertown. All women of the Presbytery of South Dakota are invited to attend.

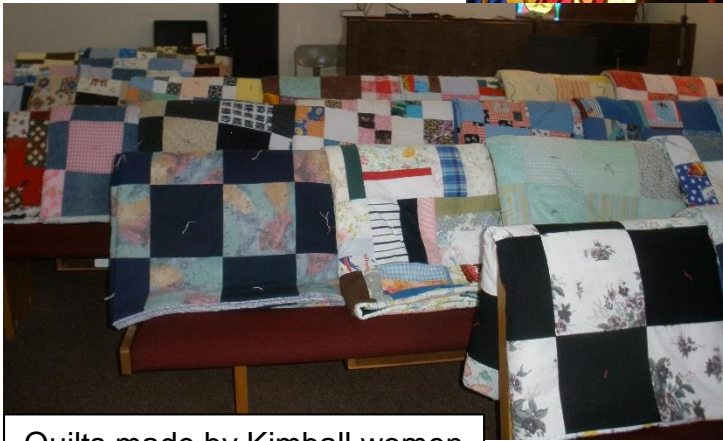

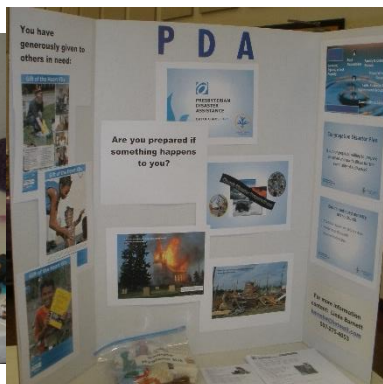

Reflecting on Light – 2018 Churchwide Gathering

This month's reflection is from Doreen Der-McLeod, chair of the program team for the Churchwide Gathering

Recognizing the Divine Spark

If you have practiced meditation or yoga, you may be familiar with the phrase “namaste.” It is a greeting, commonly used in India, when one greets a friend or a stranger. But it is more than a friendly “hello.” It literally means “I bow to you,” and signifies one soul acknowledging another soul. It is an acknowledgement of the divine spark within the other person.

As we consider the many ways that light appears in the Bible, we see that it often illuminates, enhances or brings hope. Acknowledging the divine spark, the light, in others helps us remember that we are all God's children.

In his ministry, Jesus interacted with many who were considered unworthy of his attention—Nicodemus, the tax collector, the Samaritan women and, in general, outcasts and sinners of many kinds. Could it be that Jesus saw the “spark of the divine” within each of these people more than he saw their unworthiness or uncleanness?

Light comes in degrees of illumination—bulbs, for example, range from a dim 15 watts to a bright 100 watts. When light is bright, it is easier to see, but when the light is dim or only a spark, it is easy to miss. If we do not tend the spark, it might very well extinguish itself. When we recognize the spark of God in others, we blow on it with our attention, concern and love. In so doing, we nourish it and allow that spark to glow and grow.

We live in times of great polarization, when it can be difficult to recognize the “spark of the divine” in those with whom we disagree. May we look for the “spark of the divine” in all whom we encounter.

Partners for Just Trade “Fair Trade Artisan Boxes”

Christmas in July? Purchasing fair trade products at any time of the year is fun and provides for artisans around the world. Partners for Just Trade (PJT), begun by the Presbyterian Hunger Program, continues its ministry of building partnerships between producers living in extreme poverty and consumers in North America. Presbyterian women—through purchases, grants, and offering local consignment sales (partnership boxes)—have been vital to the mission of PJT. Now, for the first time, PJT is offering their new, prepaid “Fair Trade Artisan Box.” These boxes allow you to purchase high-quality handmade fair trade products at a deep discount, then resell them at their suggested retail price. (All items come tagged with the retail prices.) You can sell them at Sunday coffee hour, women's gatherings, meetings, or to friends and family for the retail price. You keep the difference to use in your fundraising or mission efforts while supporting and promoting Fair Trade principles and PJT's artisan partners. These boxes have a retail value of more than \$300 but are available for just \$175 (and free shipping). They come with a bonus—a Bible study and companion DVD that teach the principles and importance of supporting Fair Trade.
