PW Presbytery Spring Gathering – Walking with Jesus

Plan now to attend the PWP Spring Gathering on <u>Saturday, April 29, 2017</u>, at the Kimball Protestant Parish. Registration begins at 8:30 and the gathering at 9:30 a.m. The cost of registration is \$15.00.

Bring your Special Offerings: Birthday, Least Coin and Cents-Ability (Hunger) and your Necrology list.

In the morning Judy Rops, registered nurse and breast cancer survivor, will be the mission speaker. She traveled to Palestine in April, 2016. She will present her insights of Palestinians living under oppression. She is involved with *In His Steps: Pathways of Peace*.

Mission displays can be set up the night before (Friday) from 7:00-9:00 at the Kimball Protestant Parish. One of the displays will be quilts made by the women of the Kimball Protestant Parish. Women of the Kimball Protestant Parish began making quilts in 1982 and made eight quilts. Through 2016 a total of **2,697 quilts** were made. The biggest year was 2010 with a total of 211 quilts.

Where do the quilts go? Mission is a priority. They are sent to: Lutheran World Relief; Indian Reservations (Pine Ridge and Standing Rock); Ronald McDonald House; Chamberlain Crisis Center; Lutheran Outdoors; Chamberlain Academy; plus the Kimball High School graduates; Tornado/fire victims and others in need; etc.

In 2008 twenty quilts were sent to the Rim Rock Presbyterian Camp. Another time twenty-five were sent to Tree of Life Women's Shelter (Native American). Sheryn Eckstrum is chairperson of the quilt project.

In the *Prairie Wind*, you will find a poster to display and information on motels, etc.

Cloud of Witnesses: The Community of Christ in Hebrews Bible study resources

The new *Horizons* Bible study, *Cloud of Witnesses: The Community of Christ in Hebrews*, approaches Hebrews through nine major themes: In Community with Jesus Christ; In Community with the Living God; In Community with the Living Word; In Community with God's Messengers; In Community with the Tradition of the Past; In Community with the Reality of the Present; In Community with the Hope of the Future; In Community with the Household of Faith; and In Community with All the Saints. The study was written by pastor and educator Melissa Bane Sevier (Suggestions for Leaders by Sung Hee hang). Melissa's prayer for us is that study groups and circles develop an understanding of the book of Hebrews and a stronger sense of community through this study. The study will be available March 15, 2017. *Horizons* subscribers receive their copy with the March/April magazine.

Note: A modest but timely price increase on the 2017–2018 *Horizons* Bible study (now \$10 for regular print, ecumenical and Spanish editions; \$15 for large print) has been put in place. To encourage *Horizons* magazine subscriptions, readers can continue to subscribe (by April 1 to receive this year's Bible study [regular print, English edition] with their subscription to *Horizons*) at the same subscription rate as in 2016 (\$24.95/year); the Bible study will mail with the March/April issue. Subscriptions received after April 1 will receive next year's Bible study.

Thank Offering Grant for In His Steps: Pathways of Peace Information at PWP Spring Gathering

Judy Rops received word in March that the grant application she had submitted on behalf of *In His Steps: Pathways of Peace,* was accepted for funding. This is a Thank Offering grant from Presbyterian Women in the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.), Inc. It means that over the next year and a half, the Mara I'll Mara Breast Cancer Project in Palestine will receive \$50,000.00.

The project involves Muslim and Christian women working together to improve health and quality of life for Palestinian women living in the West Bank. The purpose of the project states, as submitted in the application, "Breast cancer, the most common cancer among Palestinian women, is an urgent public health problem. This project will develop, within the local health care system, a culturally sensitive program to provide quality medical services for early breast cancer detection, diagnosis and treatment (within Palestine) for the most marginalized."

The detection of breast cancer will involve local Palestinian patient navigators trained through monies from the grant, to assist women diagnosed with breast cancer. It will also provide the navigators with skills to educate other women to do breast self-examination, improving early detection.

Judy will be speaking about her mission experience in Palestine at the meeting in Kimball in April. Plan to attend to hear more about this exciting project.

Editor's note: Judy will also be offering a class at Synod School on this topic – last week in July in Storm Lake, IA.

Reflecting on Light – 2018 Churchwide Gathering

After receiving the 2015 Presidential Medal of Freedom, Katherine Johnson said, "It was my job. And I did my job correctly and well." Her job? Being a "human computer" for NASA during the space age. In 1969, she was a hidden figure (to the public, not to the men who relied on her careful calculations) who guided Apollo 11 safely to the moon.

Katherine Johnson's work is profiled in the Oscar-nominated film (based on a best-selling book), *Hidden Figures*. Although her brilliant mind and steady nerves mattered to NASA and certainly to the men who put their very lives at risk as they hurled through earth's atmosphere, orbited the Earth and landed on the moon, the accomplishments of Katherine and her sister "human computers" remained fundamentally hidden until recently. For these mathematicians, the color of their skin and their gender were two minuses in a world that did not value either. But Katherine Johnson – and elder and longtime member of Carver Memorial Presbyterian Church in Newport News, Virginia – was steadfast in her work and put her trust in God. "Commit your work to the Lord, and your plans will be established" (Prov. 16:3). Katherine is testament to using one's gifts for the glory of God, despite difficulties and underappreciation from the people of this world. Katherine Johnson's legacy shines brightly, nevermore a hidden figure. Of the Apollo 11 mission, she said, "We told them how fast they would be going, and [that] the moon would be there when [they] got there." So they went and so it was.

Participate in the 2017 Global Exchange by making necklaces for our sisters in Indonesia

PW's 2017 Global Exchange participants will be gifting women in Indonesia with yarn necklaces during the Exchange, September 12–29, 2017. We will need lots of necklaces! Please consider participating by making necklaces for our sisters in Indonesia, using the instructions provided here by Mary Weber. Questions? Instructions

The yarn is hard to find in retail stores. Look for ribbon yarns, track yarns, or flag yarns online. Try YarnParadise.com. Your crochet hook should be large; size J is best. Pull out a length of yarn about 13 inches long and leave it unworked. On the same strand, next work a chain stitch for approximately 13 inches. About 42 stitches work for me, but it may take more or less, depending on the thickness of the yarn. Keep your work *loose*! Leave another 13 inches unworked. Cut. Pull the yarn through the last stitch and fasten off. Make as many of these chains as you want in your



necklace. I usually put five to seven together to make a necklace. After you have completed the number of chains that you want, hold them together so they line up. Then tie a knot in all of them together about three inches from the end of the chain. Tie a similar knot three inches from the other end of the strands. Tie the two ends together in another knot. Pull this knot very tight so that it will not come undone when you pull the necklace over your head. You can determine the length of your necklace by where you tie this final knot; leaving approximately one inch outside the knot will work for most women's head sizes. If you have left more than one inch at the end, measure about one inch down and trim all yarn ends to that length. If you have a shorter end, trim ends to be even. If you wish to make the necklace adjustable, pull all strands through a bead with a darning needle or small crochet hook, before tying the final knot. The bead works as a slide so the necklace can be shortened.
